Thus, grant applications are expected to identify a relevant and important issue, propose innovative research that will address the related questions, provide a rationale for the proposed team approach, and establish an appropriate timeline. The central theme of the proposed Program Project should reflect the expertise of the participating investigators, should take advantage of the institution's strengths and/or unique facilities including access to relevant clinical populations, and should be directed toward a high priority topic of significant importance in alcohol research.

The purpose of the Health Center Program New Access Points (NAP) funding opportunity is to improve the health of the nation's underserved communities and vulnerable populations by expanding access to affordable, accessible, quality, and cost effective primary health care services. NAP funding provides operational support for new service delivery sites for the provision of comprehensive primary health care services (i.e., new access points). Applicants must propose at least one full-time, permanent new access point site that has primary medical care as its main purpose.
