The application should include: 1) Title page (Project Title, PI with Contact Information and Co-Investigators), 2) Abstract (1 page), 3) Proposal (3-5 pages), 4) Budget and Budget Justification (**PI salary is not allowed**), 5) NIH Biosketch of PI and Collaborators, 6) Literature Cited and 7) Letters of Support from Collaborator(s) or Other Key Personnel or Resource Contributors.

Evaluation: Grants will be reviewed using NIH evaluation criteria wherein the study will receive an Overall Impact score based upon review of the following categories: Significance, Investigators, Innovation, Approach and Environment. Special consideration will be given to new investigators, early stage investigators, investigators new to the field of oral health research, and investigators with MUSC-Clemson collaborations. SC-TRIMH will facilitate the establishment of collaborative efforts between faculty at the College of Dental Medicine and Clemson University.
